International Residencies

YARN Storytelling Festival is thrilled to have been awarded the Arts Council International Residency Initiative Scheme support again this year, giving us the opportunity to expand our oral storytelling connections with both the World Storytelling Café and Storytellers Union for Cultural Innovation and Art of Storytelling in Marrakech.

This year, two Irish oral storytellers, Eimear Burke and Joe Brennan, each travelled to Morocco and in return we welcomed two Moroccan storytellers, Zouhair Khaznaoui and Zakia Elyoubi to Ireland.

These residency partnerships celebrate the deep connection that exists between Morocco and Ireland forged through our shared oral storytelling tradition. The residency programme is kindly supported by Killruddery House and Gardens, who will host Zakia in November during the YARN Storytelling Festival.

Threads of the Invisible – Zouhair Khaznaoui (Morocco) & Eimear Burke (Ireland)

Threads of the Invisible is a unique cross-cultural storytelling and artistic residency uniting two ancient oral traditions from Ireland and Morocco. A collaboration between Mermaid Arts Centre and the Storytellers Union for Cultural Innovation and Art of Storytelling, the project brings together renowned Irish Druid and storyteller Eimear Burke and Moroccan storyteller and cultural innovator Zouhair Khaznaoui.

The heart of the residency was a shared exploration into the spiritual and metaphysical traditions of both cultures — examining beliefs and practices around healing, the unseen realms, and mythological beings such as djinn, druids, chouafa, mqadem, and fairies. Through research visits, immersive fieldwork, and creative storytelling, the artists seek to uncover common threads that connect the spiritual fabric of Celtic and Amazigh-Arabic-African heritage.

Zouhair Khaznaoui & Eimear Burke showcased their collaboration in development in Mermaid on 9th August and again in Marrakech on 20th September.

Zakia Elyoubi (Morocco) & Joe Brennan (Ireland)

Our second international residency is a partnership between the YARN Storytelling Festival and the World Storytelling Café.

In August 2025, storyteller Joe Brennan travelled to Marrakech where he spent two weeks immersing himself in Moroccan culture and sharing traditional Irish stories with audiences. There he also met with artist Zakia Elyoubi and they began collaborating on a new storytelling piece.

As part of the YARN Storytelling Festival in November Zakia Elyoubi will come to Ireland on residency, kindly hosted by Killruddery House & Gardens. Here she will have the opportunity to share traditional Moroccan tales with Irish audiences.

Joe and Zakia will bring their collaborative performance entitled *From Desert Sands to Island Shores* to the stage at Mermaid Arts Centre on Friday 14th November at 8pm (pg. 15).
